COST: \$55 per person includes recipes, instruction and lunch and tax.

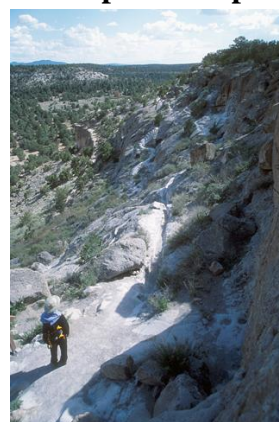

Wednesday, June 21, 2006

Tsankawi Ancient Cavedwellers Tour

Time: 3:30pm - 7:30pm

This is an in-depth introduction to the fascinating and complex historic and pre-historic Pueblo Indian civilizations. Travel through beautiful countryside, across the Rio Grande and into the shoulders of the magnificent Jemez Mountains. Tsankawi is part of the Bandelier National Monument, but is considered an OEoutlier¹. As such, it has been excavated many times, but never reconstructed. Over the 1 1/2 mile hike, you will climb up and down ladders, walk along a volcanic ridge, crawl into smoke-blackened caves and immerse yourself into early Pueblo civilization at the ancestral home of the pre-historic Pueblo Indians. Savor the same views seen by generations of Native Americans who lived here 600 years ago. This is an area so alive with the past that you can almost hear the drumbeats of the ancient ones. This is a dramatic and exciting hike exploring 10,000 years of history, geology, anthropology and archaeology.

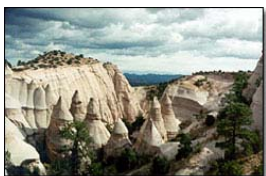

Thursday, June 22, 2006

Easy Hike to Tent Rocks

Time: 3:30pm - 7:30pm



Join us for an easy hike to the unique geological area known as Kasha-Katuwe Tent Rocks. Tent Rocks is an area that features large, tent-shaped rocks hugging the steep cliffs of Peralta Canyon. These rocks were created by the powerful forces of vulcanism and erosion, which have built up and then torn down this landscape. While uniform in shape, the tent rock formations vary in height from just a few feet to over 90. Most of the trail is a gradual sloping path through a slot canyon. A steep climb to the top of the mesa is available at the end of the trail for those interested. Please bring layered clothing, good walking shoes and sunscreen.

Pecos National Historical Park

3:30pm-7:30pm



Enjoy an adventure to Pecos National Monument, once a major landmark along the Santa Fe Trail. Pecos Pueblo was granted National Monument status in 1965, due, in part, to the efforts of actress Greer Garson and her husband, E.E. Fogelson, who owned much of the land nearby. Excavation began in 1966, and in 1967, workers discovered the foundations of the old church, some of which, along with the Pueblo itself, has been reconstructed. Offering the spectacle of the ruins of a Spanish Colonial Church, alongside pre-historic Anasazi dwellings, Pecos is one of the most visually arresting of New Mexico's Pueblo ruins. The Pueblo Indians lived on this site for more than 2,000 years before the coming of the Europeans. A professional guide will recount the stories of Pecos Pueblo and the

history of the Spanish Mission as group members follow the easy trail through the ruins. The guide can also include information on the Santa Fe Trail and stories of the Civil War Battle of Glorieta Pass.

Our Chile Amor class will delight those already familiar with New Mexico's official state vegetable and light the fires of passion for those yet uninitiated. Participants will explore chile's unique culinary and medicinal qualities, learn to identify different varieties, and discover how to handle them safely and efficiently in the kitchen. After the

Float / Rafting Trip

One of America's most popular adventures, whitewater rafting is becoming a tradition for visitors to Northern New Mexico. The rafting season begins with the snowmelt in spring and generally lasts through October. All levels of rafters, from the novice to the expert will enjoy this adventure along the Rio Grande. Along the valley floor, the rafters will experience spectacular scenery, with a full range of whitewater on the "Racecourse" south of Taos. It is recommended that the rafters bring extra clothing to change into at the take-out point. Due to safety regulations, no one under the age of seven years old or in excess of 230 pounds will be permitted to participate in this event. Waterproof suits and helmets can be provided upon request.

COST: \$65 per person for half-day rafting trip includes, transportation, guide, equipment, and guide gratuities, and tax, based on a guaranteed minimum of 6.

Backstage Opera And Shidoni Tour

12:30-3:30pm

A guided behind-the-scenes tour of the world famous Santa Fe Opera. You will visit and learn how it all happens. Everything for the opera is made right there, including costumes, wigs and stage sets. Even if you're not an opera fan you'll love this tour and gain a greater appreciation of it all. The group will then move on to the Shidoni Foundry and Sculpture Garden in the small village of Tesuque. Founded in 1971, Shidoni has grown into an internationally known Sculpture facility situated on an 8-acre apple orchard. Here you can wander the sculpture garden where monumental pieces in a variety of styles and media are displayed year-round. A tour of the foundry will show and explain the step-by-step process of the complex lost wax casting technique.
